


Mrs. Lazarchick's Newsletter

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This week in 8th grade math the students participated in a small group activity called "I have, who has". The students reviewed their prior knowledge of order of operations, solving equations, and graphing linear functions to determine if the answer to a question was on a card that they had in their possession. If so the student would state, "I have (the answer), who has (the next question)?" The students did a terrific job working with their classmates and helped one another with the content. Great job 8th grade, keep working hard!

This week in 7th grade math the students reviewed solving 1-step equations. As a class, the students went over the different inverse operations and were exposed to different types of problems. The students were then engaged in a fun game of Kahoot to ensure that they understood the concept. The next day, the students were assessed with a Do Now guiz and then completed a fun puzzle with a riddle to practice more. The riddle is "What begins with an 'e' and ends with an 'e' but has a single letter in it?" The students will learn more complicated equations next week. They have been told that they must show their work, even for the easy problems, so that they can demonstrate understanding for the harder ones. Great work 7th grade, keep working hard
