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This Week in Math:

6th Grade Math students learned a new concept this week. The students learned the definition of a ratio and the three different ways to write a ratio. The students also used different models, such as a bar diagram and a double number line diagram to solve different real-world application problems involving ratios. The students ended the week with a fun coin flipping activity where they not only found ratios, but also learned the value of probability and how it can change what might seem theoretical based on experiments.
