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This week in 8th grade math the students learned about the Pythagorean Theorem, which is derived from famous mathematician, Pythagoras. The students discussed and learned when to use the Pythagorean Theorem, how to find missing side lengths, how to use the Converse of the Pythagorean Theorem to identify if a triangle is indeed a right triangle, and also how to utilize the Pythagorean Theorem with real world application problems. The students were able to identify vocabulary, use their calculator skills, and access their prior knowledge of squares and square roots. The students were assessed at the end of the week with a quiz on the Pythagorean Theorem. Great job 8th grade, keep working hard!

This week in 6th grade math the students applied their knowledge of converting decimals, percent, and fractions with baseball cards! Using the statistics on the back of the card, the students were able to identify the fraction, decimal, and percent of singles, doubles, triples, homeruns, and outs in a given season for a given player.
