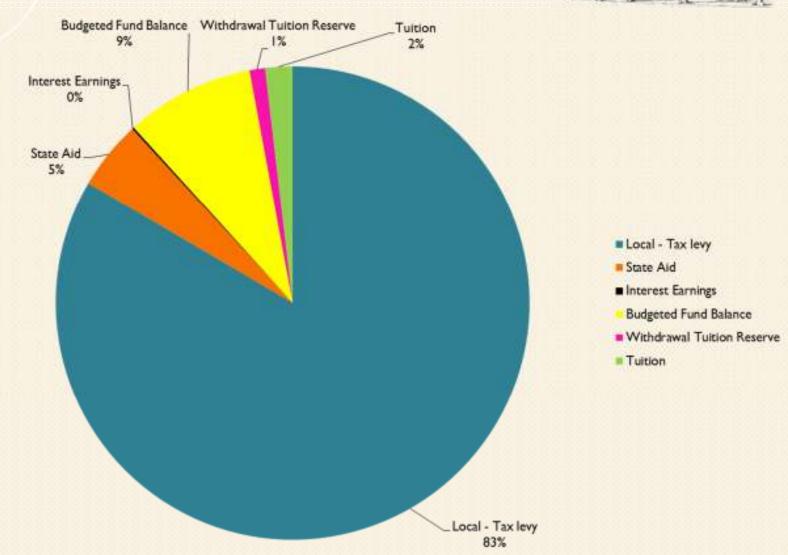

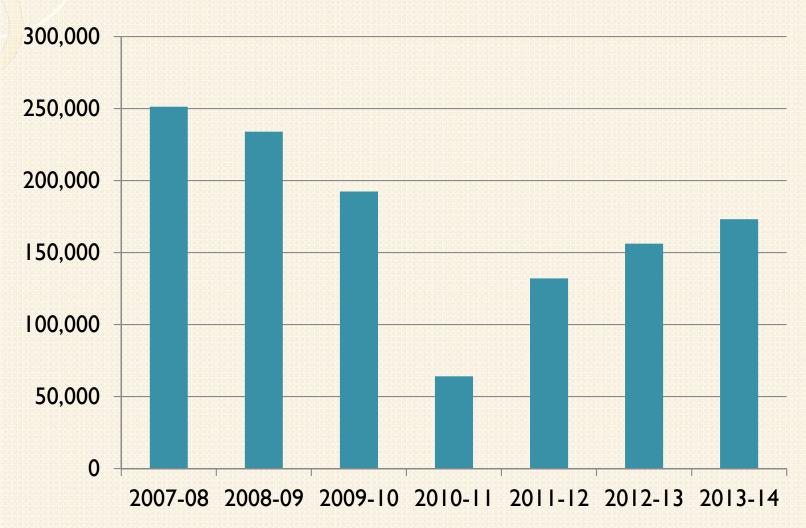

History of State Aid

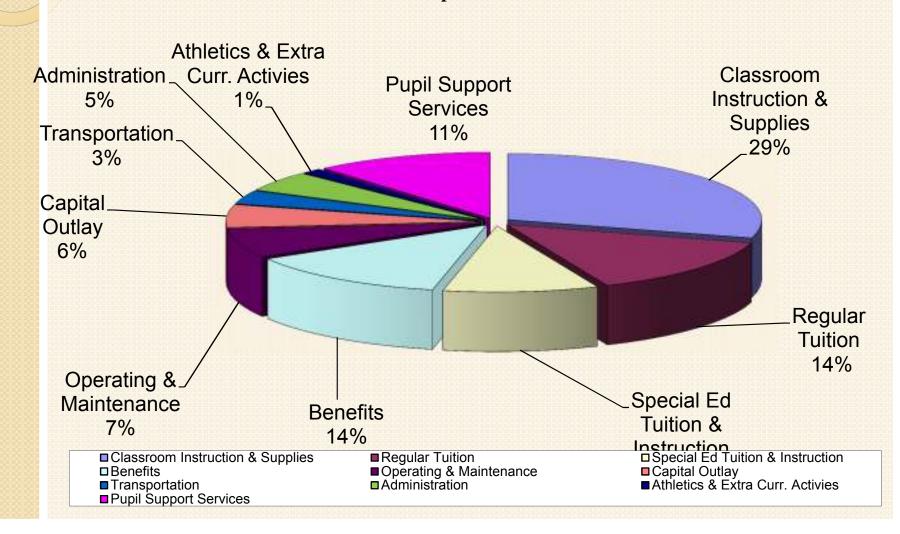

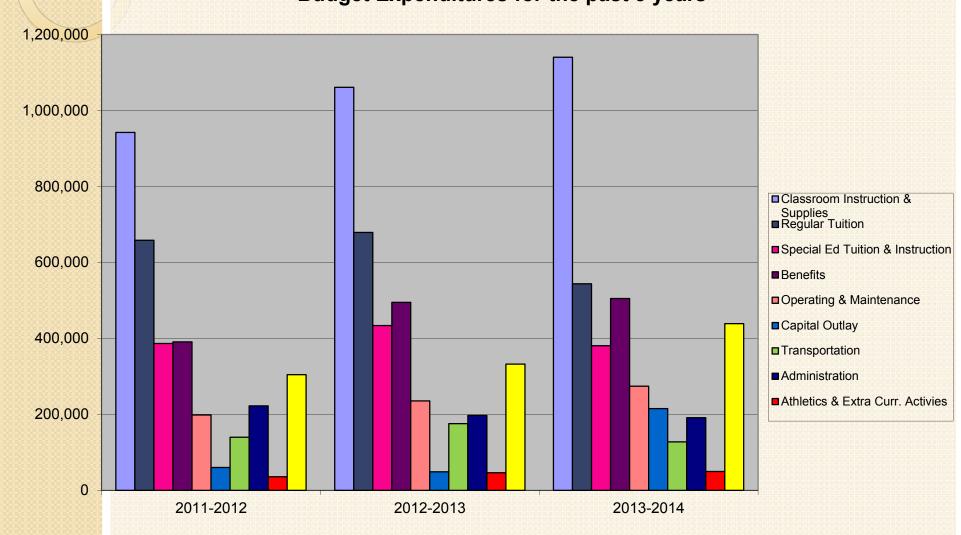


Avon-by-the-Sea Board of Education 2013-2014 School Budget Expenditures

Avon-by-the-Sea Board of Education 2013-2014 School Budget Budget Expenditures for the past 3 years



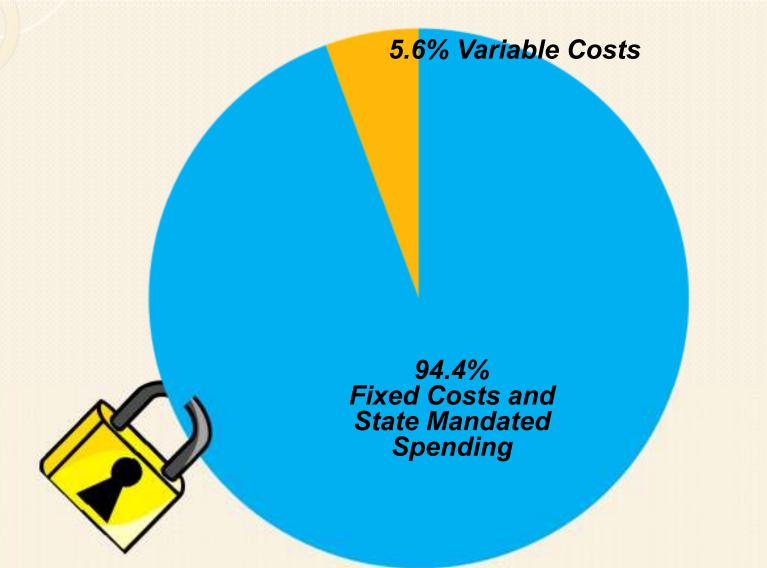
Required Spending
