As a reminder, newsletters for ELA, math, and social studies can be found on each of the teacher's websites accessible from the Avon School Home Page.

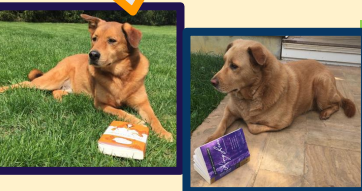
