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

We practiced Reader's Theater presentations and assessed our work. We also read our independent reading books and nonfiction articles on Newsela, and we responded to creative writing prompts. We are continuing to work with our Wordly Wise Lesson 4 words. Our Word Study tests for Wordly Wise Lesson 4 will be Friday, November 30th.

Eighth Grade continued to work with our fiction text, "The Landlady" by Roald Dahl and practiced analyzing how story elements work together to create mood.
