


A Peek at Our Week...

This Week in ELA Grades 6-8...



Seventh Grade continued analyzing our class novel. *The Giver*, by Lois Lowry, and we drafted literary essay about issues from it. We completed grammar units on NoRedInk and completed Latin and Greek root review activities. Our Latin and Greek stems test will be Monday, May 20th. We continued Wordly Wise Lesson 11 activities, and the tests will be Wednesday, May 22.

Eighth Grade began reading *The Outsiders*, by S.E. Hinton. We also completed an assessment about the short story, "The Lady or the Tiger" by Frank Stockton and the paired drama, *The Ghoice* from Scholastic *Scope*. We completed grammar units on NoRedInk, and we completed Latin and Greek root review activities. Our Latin and Greek stems test will be Monday, May 20th. We continued Wordly Wise Lesson 11 activities, and the tests will be Wednesday, May 22. We also continued our Wax Museum research. Students should be gathering information and pictures for their tri-board displays and speeches.
